CRIME

There were 105 incidents recorded for the Chester Villages in the month of September, as per the table above, not all of these incidents relate to crime taking place. Calls regarding welfare or information, road traffic collisions, are not crime. The majority of incidents this month are road traffic related, break downs, accidents, road related offences, possibly obstruction to the highways etc.

There has been 1 report of burglary in September which is a positive decrease from August, again crime prevention measures such as ring doorbells, CCTV, locked gates etc make buildings and houses less attractive to try and gain entry. Chester Villages is very fortunate that it has a comparative low level of crime to other Chester ward areas. According to the Residents Voice Survey, the majority of people feel very safe in our area. There have been a few reports about ASB in the Christleton Ponds area which we continue to patrol.

OTHER NEWS

PCSO BAILEY attended all 6 Parish Council meetings this month as they returned from recess. I have passed information about local policing activity, and Community Speed Watch updates. All Parish Councils are able to refresh CSW groups, Guilden Sutton and Littleton have formed a



group within the last year and welcome new volunteers. Littleton Parish Council agreed to purchase a speed camera on behalf of their Community Speed Watch group which is brilliant. September is the return of nursery and schools, I have worked with CWACC Parking Services to address parking outside Christleton High School, also visiting the primary schools when I am able. PCSO BAILEY visited Mickle Trafford Primary School and met with Junior Safety Officers who deployed the speed gun.

We had a busy time slowing down traffic and giving a 'thumbs up' or 'thumbs down' to drivers, depending on their speed. I popped in to 'Knit and Natter' in Rowton, and the 'Tuesday Club' in Waverton; I enjoyed meeting lots of people in the Waverton bike marking event and police surgery.

Speed enforcement with the tru – cam has been deployed in September on Brown Heath Road Christleton, Common Lane Waverton, and Tarvin Road Littleton.

Setting a start and end point lets your contact know when you arrive safely, or triggers an alert.

Meeting Feature:
A timer will countdown until you mark yourself as safe, otherwise an alert will be raised.

Man Down Feature:
The app automatically detects if you have fallen or stopped moving for a period of time - useful when being or working alone.
