1. Introduction

Mickle Trafford and District is a large Parish consisting of Mickle Trafford, Picton Village, Picton Gorse, Wimbolds Trafford, Plemstall, Bridge Trafford, Hoole Bank and Hoole Village in the unitary authority of Cheshire West and Chester. The Parish has a population of around 2,200 people.

In the event of an emergency, Mickle Trafford & District Parish Council and the community can play an important role in both responding to and recovering from the situation. Local knowledge of the area can provide invaluable assistance to responders and help the community mobilize resources quickly.

This Community Plan aims to organize resources in the Mickle Trafford area to support residents during an emergency and assist responders when they arrive. During a major emergency, it could be some time before wider assistance arrives, and this plan prepares the Parish Council and the local community to provide immediate help.

Risk	Impact on Community	Preparation/Action
Major Traffic Incident (M56)	Gridlocked traffic, disruption to daily life	Set up rest/recovery station, identify areas for stranded motorists
High Winds	Structural damage, road blockages, evacuation of residents	Set up rest station, secure property, coordinate contractors
Severe Snow and Ice	Vulnerable residents unable to access supplies	Activate volunteers, ensure supplies, coordinate evacuation if needed
Chemical Spill/Explosion/Fire	Structural damage, pollution, need to evacuate	Set up recovery station, assist emergency services
Gas Storage Explosion	Potential loss of life, homelessness, damage to property	Provide shelter, coordinate with building contractors
Train Crash	Major disruption, evacuation required	Coordinate with emergency services, set up rest centers
Flooding	Road closures, potential homelessness	Coordinate evacuation, identify vulnerable residents

Risk	Impact on Community	Preparation/Action
Subsidence	Structural damage, road closures, homelessness	Coordinate shelter, mobilize contractors
Riot/Civil Unrest	Structural damage, evacuation required	Mobilize local volunteers, secure properties, provide shelter

10. Activation Triggers

The plan can be activated by the following triggers:

- 1. A request from emergency services or the Cheshire West Emergency Planning Team.
- 2. A local incident reported directly to the Parish Council or emergency co-ordinator.
- 3. A loss of communication that prevents reaching emergency services.

11. Emergency Action Checklist

- 1. Dial 999 to notify emergency services.
- 2. Contact local council representatives (see contact list).
- 3. Log all decisions and actions.
- 4. Contact volunteers and keyholders to initiate local support.(eg through whatsapp groups)
- 5. Communicate through Parish Councils social media platforms.

12. Community Emergency Meeting

In case of an emergency, the Parish Council will assess the need for a **Community Emergency Meeting**. Key criteria include:

- Safety of the meeting location
- Informing Cheshire West and Chester Council and the wider community
